



AWARDS FOR ARTISTS

a funding information leaflet from *funderfinder*

FunderFinder PIN includes many trusts and foundations that make grants to people involved in the arts but does not usually include prizes and awards which are based on artistic merit. This document suggests sources of information in this area and some useful organisations.

General

The Arts Councils administer award schemes for individual artists across the various disciplines of the arts. Information about the grant schemes they administer are usually available on their websites. They may also be able to provide information about other sources of funding and advice.
